Opener Options • Hand out coloring sheets with crayons and markers. • Hand out white paper with crayons to draw a ladder; then have kids draw an angel shape with a glue stick and sprinkle with glitter! • Have older kids cut up Psalm 139:1-18, and have them each pick a verse for activity time.

Story and Activity Time After you tell or read the story from Genesis 28: 1-22, ask questions like:


- Why did Jacob leave home?"

After they answer questions, let them share stories about their dreams. Reinforce that God is always with us. Memorize the memory verse (Genesis 28:15).


Older kids can take turns standing and saying their parts of Psalm 139:1-18, starting with verse 1, then 2, etc.
