# Called to be a Chef of God's Word

Why do we enjoy food so much? Seriously! At a practical level, food is simply fuel for our bodies. Like gasoline to a car, we ought to be able to simply eat what we need three times a day and get on with life. And yet, countless hours and dollars are spent on marketing food, developing recipes, and creating enjoyable environments in which to eat. Of course, a respected occupation is that of the Chef. What does a Chef do? He studies food so he can prepare the best possible meal. She knows her patrons so she can present the food in a way that is pleasing to the eyes and nose as well as to the taste. A Chef transforms food from fuel into an enjoyable experience that can be savored and relished in the hope that those who dine will be back for more.

### There are many wonderful comparisons between what a Chef does for food and what a teacher of God's Word can do for

**biblical truth.** Practically speaking, truth is just the fuel of life. If we eat well, we can live healthier lives. If we live by the truth, we will live better lives too. One offers our best chance at a long life on earth; the other offers the only chance at eternal life. If we consistently take in a healthy dose of truth and let it permeate our lives, just as nutrients soak into our physical system, our souls can be healthy in this life as well as the next.

But do we eat healthy naturally? No. That is why there are entire industries

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devoted to trying to attract us to good eating, if not healthier eating. Food is presented in such a way as to draw us in and attract us. Food is enjoyable, but there is no lasting impact. We will soon need to eat again, and few of us can remember what we ate last week, let alone a year ago. What did you have to eat for dinner on September 7th, 1990? I know I had seasoned chicken stuffed with stuffing with mashed potatoes and a side of veggies. How do I know? It was at a memorable event I will never forget. We can do the same with our teaching! You can create attractive and enjoyable spiritual meals that will be remembered for years to come. And those that aren't long remembered will have contributed to the ongoing spiritual health of those you teach.

#### You can be a Chef of God's Word!

Why is this important? God has commanded us to make sure our children grow up knowing and appreciating our faith. Deuteronomy 4:9 says,

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"Only BE CAREUL, and watch yourselves closely so that you do not forget the things your eyes have seen or let them slip from your heart as long as you live. TEACH THEM TO YOUR CHILDREN and to their children after them." (Deuteronomy 4:9)

We have a mandate from God to make sure our children do not forget the important lessons we have learned, both from our own life experiences, as well as the things that were entrusted to us!

In I Timothy 4:13 Paul admonishes the young pastor, "Until I come, DEVOTE YOURSELF to the public reading of Scripture, to preaching and to teaching." I know if you are reading this, you are devoted to teaching children. Teaching children is not merely a duty; it is something we must be devoted to. Later, in Titus, Paul says, "In everything set them an example by doing what is good. In your teaching SHOW INTEGRITY, SERIOUSNESS."

They say at Awana Clubs that "no fun means no kids!"

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Teaching is something that requires seriousness! Our presentation may be very light and fun, but behind it is a very serious motivation. I can't even count how many times in ministry, after talking to a volunteer or parent about why I do things the way I do (often when being asked about some crazy thing I did), they end up saying something like, "Wow, I never realized how serious you are about this." The "fun" I bring to my teaching often masks the seriousness behind why I am so fun. The fun is not the goal; it is a means to accomplishing something I am dead serious about: effective teaching.





I've heard it a thousand times, "Kids just need the Word, they don't need all this fun stuff. Just preach the Word!" That sounds very spiritual — but if "just preaching the Word" means simply reading it and talking at the kids, and they go home uninspired, unchallenged, uninterested or without understanding, then we have failed. When I am asked to explain my methods there is a passage I love to turn to. Nehemiah 8:8 states,

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"They read from the book of the Law of God, MAKING IT CLEAR AND GIVING THE MEANING so that the people could understand what was being read." Nehemiah 8:8

Your role as a teacher of God's Word is exactly that--to not just read the Word, but to "make it clear and give the meaning" so that the kids can understand what is being read.

#### You are a Chef of God's Word!

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You have the high calling of creating an environment, setting a mood, and preparing and presenting God's Word in a way that children will understand, enjoy, and be eager to come back for more! If you devote yourself to this task with integrity and seriousness, you will make a huge impact on those you teach for years to come! Someday, as adults, your students will be describing your lessons and, more importantly, making life decisions based on the Truth you taught them so creatively.
